

## When is Easter? It Depends.



Easter is a moveable feast, unlike Christmas. Easter can be as early as March 22 and as late as April 25 - in Western Christianity. In the Eastern Church (Greek and Russian Orthodox, for example), things are a little different. In A.D. 325 Constantine, emperor of the Holy Roman Empire, convened the Council of Nicaea. Among the business before the council was to establish a uniform date for Easter. Out of the discussion and debate came the "Easter Rule," setting Easter on the first Sunday after the first full moon after

the vernal equinox. As is often the case with church councils, the decision was not unanimous.

The Eastern bishops wanted to schedule Easter in conjunction with the Jewish Festival of Passover since; Jesus went to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. The Western bishops preferred a date corresponding with the beginning of spring, because that was the time already established for a lot of pagan celebrations, and they figured to capitalize on the momentum. This is why, to this day, we have such things as the Easter Bunny and colored eggs associated with Easter.

Well, on this, and other issues, the church eventually split, such as may be happening to our wonderful denomination. (I promise conversation on that matter in the future) The result of the split is we descendants of the Western Christendom use a different date than the Eastern Christian churches. Sometimes our celebration falls on the same day. Sometimes it varies as five weeks!

That was more than you probably wanted to know. Let me ask again: When is Easter? I say Easter is today, and not just today. Easter isn't so much a date on the calendar as a date with the living God. Easter was when Jesus was raised from the dead and we aren't sure of that date.

Easter happens each time Christ is raised in our hearts. So, Happy Easter to you today! Christ is being raised every day at FUMC, Pflugerville, and even in our messy United Methodist Church. In case you are wondering, Easter is April 21. I hope to see you each Sunday as we make our way to Easter Sunday.





## Rosales Family Story

The promise of opportunity is what brought Laura Rosales, and her family, to Austin from the small south Texas town of Kenedy as a teenager. It is what continues to drive her today as a hardworking, single mother of five and dispatcher at Jerry's Texan Towing. Despite once finding stability and promise in Austin, Laura now finds herself struggling to provide her family with a consistent and safe place to live due to the lack of affordable housing.



Laura shares a two-bedroom duplex in South Austin with her five children; Josiah (2), Michael (6), Michaela (8), Ray (12), and Kaithlyn (16). This living arrangement requires that some of the children sleep in the living room, so privacy and time to one's self come at a premium in the Rosales household. A home of her own will give Laura the ability to provide her children a permanent place to live and free them from the stress and frustration that accompanied the family's frequent moves to escape rising rent costs.

Laura is excited that home ownership will give her the opportunity to demonstrate skills to her children about financial management, and the care and upkeep of a home. She wants them to enjoy the intangible benefits that most people take for granted like playing in the backyard. Laura believes that she can now serve as a role model for her children and that this opportunity will positively influence the children's outlook towards their own futures.

To Laura, Austin's appeal comes from the compassion and generosity of its residents, and she sees those same characteristics in Austin Habitat for Humanity by saying "it feels like a family."
