

Financial Literacy Coalition
Central Texas

The Financial Literacy Coalition of Central Texas (FLCCT) is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization that offers free financial education classes and financial literacy resources to Central Texas. Participants in FLCCT's classes gain a better understanding of the consumer marketplace and the economic environment while learning skills necessary to take charge of their financial situations, plan for the future, and avoid financial predators.

The Central Texas Food Bank has partnered with FLCCT to further the goals of the ReThink Hunger initiative and continue our commitment of providing holistic ways to address hunger. Trained volunteers from FLCCT will visit several of our partner agency sites to teach a series of financial literacy classes. Some classes include topics such as "How to Establish and Maintain Good Credit," "Creating a Spending Plan," and "Financial Recovery". However, FLCCT is working with each individual partner agency to create a customized curriculum for each pantry's needs.

St. Ignatius Martyr Food Pantry, Churches Touching Lives for Christ and Shepherd's Heart of Taylor are the three partner agencies participating in the pilot this summer. Many other partners expressed interest in FLCCT classes at the Partner Agency Conference this past May, so keep a lookout for more announcements about availability this Fall! 
